Policy Statement	In accordance with state and federal law and regulation, the District shall provide programs of instruction for Multilingual Learners (MLLs) in kindergarten through 12 th grade.	
	Instruction	
	 Programs of instruction shall include formal instruction in 	
	English and instruction in academic subjects designed to provide MLLs access to the regular curriculum. In selecting program(s), the District shall choose those that are research-based and have been shown to be effective.	
	The goals of instructional programs shall be prompt	
	acquisition of full English proficiency and academic instruction equivalent in scope to those provided for all students.	
	 Instruction shall be delivered by those who meet state 	
	licensure and certification requirements and are trained in instruction of MLLs.	
	 Student participation in programs is voluntary, and a 	
	parent/guardian may refuse such placement in writing.	
	Registration Information on the student's first acquired language and the language(s) spoken in the student's home shall be ascertained as part of the registration process.	
	Assessment and Identification	
	• Any student for whom a language other than English is	
	reported shall be given an English language proficiency assessment by a trained and qualified person as soon as practicable, but not later than 25 school days after enrollment.	
	• The assessment shall be approved by the state which shall	
	identify eligibility scores for MLL instruction in the areas of listening, speaking, reading, and writing.	
	• Students whose scores do not meet eligibility standards shall	
	be identified as MLL and shall be entitled to a program of instruction designed to meet their needs.	

	 Students exceeding the state eligibility scores shall be placed
	in a general classroom, but their academic performance shall be monitored for two years. Those exhibiting academic difficulties shall be re-assessed and may be placed in a language program or provided with additional instructional services.
	Communication
	The District shall ensure that communication with
	parent/guardians, including notices of eligibility for programs for MLLs, information on the student's educational performance, and school information provided to all parents, shall be provided in English and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parent/guardian can understand.
	 Parents/guardians shall be notified of their child's placement
	in a language program and options associated with that placement, including reasons for identifying the child as MLL and a description of the program.
	Evaluation The District shall prepare an annual evaluation of its program in compliance with state regulations and shall provide data to the state as required.
Responsibility	The Superintendent shall be responsible for compliance.
